In addition to the above listed units of study, we will be working with the children on the following skills:

Cognitive (Including Verbal Communication)

1. Uses words to express wants
2. Talks-names 10 to 15 objects and a few familiar people or pets; has a small non-verb vocabulary
3. Uses pronouns me and my; shows possessive spirit
4. Names three familiar pictures in picture book
5. Points to parts of a doll or body (hair, mouth, eyes, etc.)
6. Makes two- or three-word sentences

7. Complies with simple commands, such as: retrieving; no-no; fetches; carries; or goes
8. Listens with interest to short nursery rhymes
9. Matches, compares familiar objects as to color, form, or size; groups similar objects, such as blocks
10. Counts two: aware of one more, knows how many, to two

Social and Emotional

11. Shows affection; carries or hugs doll; shows regard for people or possessions
12. Occupies self, initiates own play activities or on simple suggestion
13. Explores, investigates surroundings, adventures in new ways

Motor Skills

14. Walks backward
15. Climbs—furniture and obstacles
16. Walks up steps with help of banister or wall, not on all fours
17. Kicks ball forward
18. Throws ball overhand (not directed in aim)
19. Runs
20. Stacks blocks three high
21. Unwraps, removes covers from candy or other objects, or peels bananas
22. Disassembles—takes simple objects apart with minimal difficulty; unfastens clothing

Hygiene and Self-Help

23. Drinks from cup or glass unassisted, but spills occasionally
24. Removes simple garment
25. Uses spoon, spills a lot
26. Begins toilet training, asks for toilet

Spiritual

27. Shows pride in toilet achievement and concern about failures
28. Associates “God or Jesus loves you” with warm feelings from parents and other care givers.
29. Senses others are happy when they talk to God
30. Recognizes that Jesus was a baby, a boy, then a man
31. Recognizes that at church, people sing and talk about God and Jesus
